

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

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HOW TO FEST

TICKETS > ONLINE IN ADVANCE

To purchase tickets for films and parties, visit GASPARILLAFILMFESTIVAL.COM and click on BUY TICKETS. Select the film or event you wish to attend and follow the directions to purchase.

PICK UP & PROCEDURE

Patrons who have purchased tickets online and have a printed ticket can go directly to the theatre of the film screening. If you are unable to print your ticket in advance you may go to the GIFF Box Office-Will Call to pick up your ticket. You must have a photo ID or have your purchase receipt.

All patrons - whether credentialed or ticketed- must arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the film showtime. Patrons arriving fewer than 15 minutes prior to showtime cannot be guaranteed a seat, even with a ticket or a pass. Additionally, if you are not seated 5 minutes before the film starts, your seat will be released to our wait list / rush line.

DAY OF SHOW SALES

If you haven't ordered online and wish to purchase a ticket for a film that day, please go to the GIFF Box Office (at the theatre of the screening) to purchase in person.

WAIT LIST/RUSH LINE SALES

A dedicated rush line will be available for SOLD OUT films before the start time. At 5 minutes prior to film screening we will start selling tickets on an available seat basis.

EXCHANGES

There are no refunds. Tickets may be exchanged for another screening subject to availability.

PASSES

FILM PASS PROCEDURE & BENEFITS

Pass holders receive priority front of line entry to the theatre. Passes ADMIT ONE person to each film screening and cannot be shared. You must arrive at the theatre 15 minutes prior to the scheduled screening time and be seated 5 minutes prior to show time or your seat will be given to wait list / rush line patrons.

Passes are for IN THEATER FILMS AND VIRTUAL FILMS and do not include parties unless otherwise noted. Event tickets are available for purchase on our website GASPARILLAFILMFESTIVAL.COM (subject to availability).

Choosing the right story while working with a group of diverse filmmakers is key for producers Joseph Restaino and Tony Stoppperan, co-producers of Lady of The Manor.

About Joseph Restaino, Hungry Bull Productions



Joe Restaino is a p.g.a. marked film producer based out of Tampa, FL. He is the principal of Hungry Bull Productions, an independent film production company created in 2012 to produce and package feature length films. He has produced over 15 films that have been released, currently in post-production as well as in preproduction. Joe is a client of William Morris/Endeavor Content.

He is currently Executive Producing Katie Aselton's Mack & Rita starring Diane Keaton which shoots in LA and Palm Springs in the spring of 2021. At the 2021 Sundance Film Festival he Executive Produced the film Passing which premiered in the Narrative Competition to outstanding reviews and a \$15.75 million Netflix purchase. The film is Rebecca Hall's directorial and stars Tessa Thompson, Ruth Negga, Alexander Skarsgaard and Andre Holland and was produced alongside Forest Whitaker's company Significant Productions. Also in February of 2021, Lionsgate released theatrically and on-demand – Fear of Rain starring Katherine Heigl, Harry Connick, Jr., Madison Iseman and Israel Broussard which was made in Tampa.

In 2020, he produced Justin Long's directorial debut, the romantic-comedy Lady of the Manor starring Melanie Lynskey, Judy Greer, Ryan Phillippe, Luis Guzman, Patrick Duffy and Long. The film will be released by Lionsgate in September of 2021.

Joe serves on the boards and juries of several U.S. and International film festivals. He is proud to be an SIO member of Sundance Film Institute, IFP alum and industry representative at several editions, as well as a contributor to Steppenwolf Theatre in Chicago. He lives in Tampa, FL with his wife Megan and twin daughters Mia and Lyla and is a Communications graduate of Florida State University.

TONY STOPPERAN is an Emmy® Award-Winning producer, writer and director. As principal for House of John Productions, he is currently in post-production on Justin Long's directorial debut feature LADY OF THE MANOR, starring Long, Melanie Lynskey, Judy Greer, Luis Guzman, Patrick Duffy and Ryan Phillippe.

His most recent credits include

Michael Sarnoski's directorial debut PIG starring Nicolas Cage and Alex Wolff which was purchased by NEON, LIONSGATE's FEAR OF RAIN (2020) starring Madison Iseman, Harry Connick Jr. and Katherine Heigl, Kevin Smith's horror anthology KILROY WAS HERE (2020), SKYMAN (2020) directed by THE BLAIR WITCH PROJECT'S Dan Myrick, Tim Sutton's 2016 Sundance Selection DARK NIGHT. 


